


### Stakeholders are human like persons

# robot vaccuum cleaner Philips Research Lab. including customer survey ±1975

Do you like the robot?

Demo: ashtray upside down in empty room

Switch on robot 200 W

Expectations: vaccum cleaner is better as the power is higher 2000 W is ok.

The robot is very inefficient. It doesn't see the ash on the carpet.

Corners are importent to look after. Robot doesn't reach the corners.

A vacuum cleaner has a dust bag. This robot doesn't.

Conclusion: I am more efficient. My vacuum cleaner is better and cheaper I don't like it

Conclusion managment: There is no need for robots in vacuum





#### 2000 Watt vacuum cleaner


#### **About 1982**




## Injection needles THE ±1976





### Injection needles punch the vanes




Can you invent a needle that not punches the skin and vanes to avoid particles in vanes and shorten or avoid bleeing?


Yes we can!




#### Use of needle should be 180° rotated




